BRIEF: Our TriCity Classic has a long run tradition, theme being combine of a known movie linked directly to specific geography. This time not so obvious as say in past, with “ The Good German ”, “Battle of Britain ” or “ Out Of Africa ”.

“ **Top Gun** ” actually covers a currently topical and historical range of current world real estate, yet stays within the movie.

Geography “on theme” is entire **USA (within 1776-present)** , also that of *any combatant parties generally recognized to be part of the 1964 to 1973 Vietnam Conflict* (core years of major US involvement and in keeping with original movie plot point)

FOR CONTEST : **ANY and ALL MODEL SUBJECTS are encouraged, warmly welcomed to enter.** Contest Theme just way to have some fun, set an overall tone for show from one year to the next. So, PLEASE FEEL FREE to ignore it entirely or plunge headlong into the fray, as you see fit. Just see fit to enter show and enjoy is all the Contest Director here wishes for.

Within this Reference , I will try to illustrate and perhaps excite some interest in competing for some of these. Award for the Best Entry befitting the Contest Theme “ *TOP GUN* ”
(Entry Subject anything USA 1776 to 2026, or directly related to 1964 to 1973 Vietnam Conflict)

BRIEF: While entire plot of first movie and decades later followup employ primarily USA, more specifically US Naval Air assets in tale told, in (movie) real time, some key specific point references are made to the history that has passed. Namely later years of definitive US role in the Vietnam Conflict (correctly referred such as never a declared war, just like Korea). With of course reference to fact of having to disrespect people's memories, legacies and their sacrifices made; “all for the greater good or in saving face for current politics, keeping in mind what's in the big picture”, with its real world consequences in downplay.

The number of debate stances, topics relative to this real world practice are immaterial to this Contest Director. The true history of many who died in service of their causes unheralded, unknown to this day or being as officially portrayed utterly inaccurately purposely, not in question as fact or practice.

Merely excellent that practice is provided in movie as plot device. So now allows a framing of more specific geographic/timing theme to be added to this contest's theme. So perhaps you see there's more than a “ hoo ray USA ” cheer lead going on here.

So be creative. Consider that if you're a real passionate soul on particular subject, your model render will reflect it undoubtedly, then it's one you'd be willing to put your name so to speak on the signup sheet line for this. Otherwise, go with movie specific obvious tie-ins such as F-14, A-4, F-5 aircraft (not necessarily in movie versions, mind you) Already I have given confirmation a “ Final Countdown F-14 ” is as eligible as real life Gulf of Sidra shootdown Tomcats. Remember the sequel Maverick movie had several other qualifiers which may not initially come to mind. Or go directly to the SE Asia specific angle offer here.

QUALIFYING: Anything from the USA 1776-2026 (be aware you do have to sign up on sheet to be considered). Again as plot, anything directly in relationship to 1964 to 1973 period of USA-Vietnam Conflict. **Don't forget that busts, figures for instance, of real people or representative (NVA Soldier, USA Grunt, SVNAF Pilot) could easily qualify, or past Presidents !** Of course, closer your entry actually adheres to the spirit of the theme basis, the more weight it will be given in the final judgement.

Best Grumman “ CAT ”, Armored “ CAT ”, or “ BIRD ” subject

BRIEF: Our “Tripoley” award series this year features a wider than first appears range . Work titled to fit within theme in a manner that’s coherent to the basis movie, however one is not limited by it. One perhaps offers small number of options, but is quite viable. Other two offer more range, also more work!

SA4A – Grumman “ CAT ” . Grumman’s rich history of achievements, yet one particular group has been a signature of theirs which ended fittingly with flagship of our theme movie. Entire lineup began with arguable “last of their Barrels from the Iron Works” ; F4F Wildcat. This airplane is as much a link to preceding FF-1, F2F, F3F as it is clearly start of the Grumman Cats.

So yes, you are type limited to all these Grumman officially named feline products. Almost all saw actual service somewhere in their lives which increases the variety. F4F, F6F, F7F, F8F, F9F, F10F, F11F, F14 are your specific limits. Mind you, all of the “foreign” employments do count, so don’t be narrow or feel put off competing here. In fact if you go with option of “ Martlet ” you are qualified for entry here and “ Best Bird ” . So go forth and claw your way to victory.



And yes I am making a blatant plea here for SOMEONE to please brave entering “ **The Tomcat’s Dad** ”, seen here at the left. Wha?

Yes, this is *the one and only JAGUAR*, the Grumman XF-10F-1.

Which has been offered in scale model form in resin, vacform and paper in several scales from 1/144 to 1/32. If you were to do one, you could sign up for SA4A, SA19 and have an inside shot at the SA15 which is Contest Director’s direct choice. Just saying,..

How is it Tomcat’s Dad ? It’s Grumman’s first SWING WING for the USN, predating the F-111B and F-14, *go look it up*.

SA4B – Armored “CAT” Alright, first the Contest Director wanted to be VERY CLEAR here, Armor modelers deserve a special award “in theme” shot, being recognized as major entry contributors to every big open range model contest. While may somewhat be taken as stretch by my use of “CAT” I hope to make sure here now that it’s well understood for this award.

Right off, all German WW2 Panther and Tigers eligible, as well 8 wheeled “PUMA” armor recon vehicle. There is also the Panzer II Luchs (Lynx) from same period, of course postwar they have the Leopard family of modern MBTs to choose from.

USA fans know M18 Hellcat works. Perhaps more challenging, but they are valid, these “modern day armored ‘cats’ exist:



So research, don't be shy. Also consider
“ARMORED MARITIME VESSELS”

AND NOW ON THE RIGHT –

*a sneaky lead into the last of the three here for
“Best Of The Best” that shows a qualifier* in
SA4C, yet which ISN'T listed on next page...*



SA4C – “ BIRD ” Arguably not the most obvious for some, how it ties to movie theme, perhaps seems somewhat scope limited.

Award for the Best Post 1976 USA Subject
OR
QUALIFYING “ **FIRE** ” Subject

BRIEF: Closing loop of the three part series of TriCity Contest Theme Specific awards (Overall, Tripoley, Closer). Again as “post” annum theme direct tie to movie then and now, while also meshing directly with the 250th USA anniversary theme too.

Okay, original movie was actually released in 1986 (as noted earlier, makes this 40th anniversary year) with its sequel of “Top Gun: Maverick” debut 2022. Consider though, the original film is inarguably iconic American culture, sequel every bit as good, which is impressive in itself considering the time gap between them. Yet the storylines mesh, real values are maintained, a solid dramatic continuity exists without being forced. A true love of country, family, real friend expressed in utterly American terms

In the first movie, Pete Mitchell learns of his dad’s ultimate sacrifice and the coverup for accepted rationale of it. All of which took place during a dark period of modern American history immediately preceding final fall of South Vietnam in 1975. There, 30 years after the end of WW2 which set forth American leadership in shaping postwar world. Post 1976 began the renewal of American spirit, a return to having a faith in ourselves as a nation. Seems appropriate enough marker by itself.

Fittingly, it’s the device of RIO “Goose” as character that emotionally and physically links the two movies, 250th anniversary as my theme here for the award. Do recall, “Great Balls of Fire” by Jerry Lee Lewis sung by the Bradshaw clan is the wormhole time tunnel between 1986, 2022 Maverick and his RIO Goose’s son. You can’t get too much more AMERICAN than Jerry Lee, and that song rocks anyway you play it. So, like the overall theme award, more here than just a surface cheer lead for 250th anny

QUALIFYING : ANYTHING directly supportable as post 1976 U.S.A subject matter (yes, hypothetical/”futuristic” do count) so go crazy as you like here: Figures, Aircraft, Ships, Military vehicles, Automotives, Buildings, everything USA. OR go with **FIRE**: Fire Equipment/Personnel, Fire Bombers, Flamethrower AFVs, Flamethrower Soldiers, FIRE BREATHING Dragons, the Human Torch, Pokemon class FIRE (only). ***SORRY, Firefly tanks/planes/SF alone*** do not qualify as such, nor similar vein

“ Know A Hornet’s Mighty Sting ”

Award for the Best American Fighter Aircraft

SYNOPSIS: One of Our Free Hornets, hereafter known as Sir Bob 1759, O.B.E. (Our Benefactor Extraordinaire) weary of all this model nonsense, retired it to pursue other passions. *Offered to provide some means to carry forth our mission*, to be the Acme of Sarcastic Scale Modelling. *If we actively promote our hobby, and share this opportunity for others to join us*. Rather than be elitist, selfish and just plain crazy not to. Failure to do this is not an option. That would be simply dishonorable, plus anger the Contest Dir, whose generous friend this is. Against Bob’s wishes but with his knowledge, I inaugurated this award in his honor at TriCity 8. Seems appropriate enough, given that his absolute **favorite** subject of scale models or in history, is the **American Fighter Aircraft**. Especially those Curtiss Hawks...

THE CONTEST : In order to be eligible for this award, your entry subject simply must be something American Made , tasked as a Fighter mission aircraft, even if never actually was operated or served as one. Sorry, eligibility requirements EXCLUDE such otherwise worthy subjects such as Spitfires, Mosquitos, Fiat G.91 or similar American operated but not made here, craft.

Clarification: “hypothetical” or “paper designs” are eligible, as long as they are based on real proposals or project. Examples of these include the Republic P-69 or F-103, Bell P-59 or F-109, North American F-108 or Lockheed L-1000.

Further incentive; given the subject is not exactly a rare personal favorite (American Fighters): This Special Award remains as planned feature of all future Fremont Hornets “annual contests”. Regardless form they may take or themes otherwise selected.

So running out of steam to complete a “ stinging ” entry this year, still won’t penalize you in vying for it next, in other words.

“ Lightning Strikes Twice ”

Award for the Best Twin Engine Lightning ... ***OR - see addenda****

SYNOPSIS: Again, not specifically linked to the overall theme for this TriCity Eighteen. Instead a little “repeat fun” from the Contest Director (who loves all Lightnings), has offered this in prior TC-12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 so still finds it worth sponsoring

Right now, the simplest outlining of what is eligible is this: ANY SCALE and ANY VERSION of these listed AIRCRAFT:

English Electric Lightning, Lockheed Aircraft Lightning, Arado AR-234 “Blitz” (Lightning in German)

Take careful note, these are all “Twin Engined” designs at their outset, and all officially “Lightning” by name

As long as your subject entry(ies) fit inside that outline, you’re good to go. Any other effort, will be judged as dicey at best.

THE CONTEST : So ANY number of those subjects is eligible to start with.

They don’t have to be REAL (hypotheticals welcome) in case you’d like to see “alternate universe” for any of these in other employments as means to cause you to build one of them. UNFINISHED is a category too, don’t be shy when you consider the fact that all three indeed, may take more time to complete than you’d need. Still eligible by these rules, though likely a little less competitive if one is taking that route.

Be sure to sign up is all !

“ Lightning Strikes Twice ”

TRADITIONALLY, an Award for the Best *Twin Engine Lightning*

Thusly what is eligible is this: *ANY SCALE* and *ANY VERSION* of these listed AIRCRAFT:

English Electric Lightning, Lockheed Aircraft Lightning, Arado AR-234 “Blitz” (Lightning in German)

Take careful note, these are all “Twin Engined” designs at their outset, and all officially “Lightning” by name

As long as your subject entry(ies) fit inside that outline, you’re good to go. **IF YOU GO WITH TRADITION**

BUCKING TRADITION for THIS YEAR’S SA7 AWARD

POTENTIALLY YOU MAY

ALSO ENTER

ANY COMBINATION

As PAIR of SINGLE ENGINE LIGHTNINGS

AS OUTLINED:

Examples: J7W1 Shiden (Magnificent Lightning), *Macchi MC 200 Saetta* (Lightning), *Lockheed F-35* (Lightning II), *N1K1 Shiden* and *N1K2J Shiden Kai* (Violet Lightning and Violet Lightning Improved).

ANY of THESE in ANY SCALE as long as PAIRED by ONE ENTRANT

REAL SIMPLE: Mary Modeller signs up on SA7 Special Award Sheet noting she has a 1/144th scale F-35 Lightning in Cat 17 and a 1/32 scale MC 200 in Cat 18. Andy Assembler is right behind her with a 1/72 J7W1 in Cat 7 and a 1/48 N1K2J Shiden Kai in Cat 12. **Mick Maniac** has a 1/32 F-35 in Cat 19 and 1/72 N1K1 Shiden in CAT 7, also a 1/48 MC200 and a J7W1 in Cat 12, as well as a 1/32 scratchbuilt XP-49 in Cat 18 and a 1/72 resin XP-58 in Cat 9. **But he forgets about sign up on the sheets** so Judges safely ignore his entries entirely. So Mary or Andy may win, if no one else has signed up any entries either way. Got it?

“ Best of Category or Show ”

BASICS for SA1 and SA2 Award QUALIFY:



While “ Best of Show ” would seem self explanatory, I think it would help to review how this decision is arrived at the TriCity Classics for now.

The actual full title says it better for both Senior and Junior/Youth BOS awards, namely “Judge’s Best of Show”

First place winners in all categories at the event where such were given and now eligible for Best of, are listed for the TC Head Judge to get his team together to go over, determine each so that everyone is now on the same page since many of them will not have judged many of the contenders in the initial 1/2/3 passes. Seen them, perhaps, but Judged?, not likely.

Then a first cut is made by the team to winnow down to a workable set of usually 8 to 15 contenders for the final or next to final pass for the BOS decision. In the case of the Junior/Youth, it’s usually gotten on the first pass as the number of contenders is usually not even the full ten to start out with. The Senior categories can sometimes go for two further passes to make sure everyone is in an agreement such as possible, for BOSS. There you have it.

Not so simple as that, but it’s the best fairest manner we all agree on. Popular or People’s Best of Show, well, sorry, not a fan of creating that chaos. On left, the actual YOUTH/JUNIOR BOS award for TC-15. The Senior was alike but larger. *WE WILL SEE WHAT WE WILL GET for TC-18 later*

BASICS for SA8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and SA13 Award QUALIFY:

Well again, these Special Awards for “Best In Category” winners don’t actually make themselves so clear, self explanatory and such. Plus some folks do know it’s somewhat skewed on a mathematical basis. Why, how you ask, isn’t that unfair? Not really, by virtue there is a lot of Air, Armor and Auto categories, but the Ship, Spaceship, Figure, Diorama , SF/Fantasy categories come down to much smaller amounts to be winnowed to just one winner. Many have tried to change the math but honestly, at club, regional, Nation level competition the same skews exist for the same reasons.

Given the expected turnouts over numbers of tens of years as a guide, there’s not much point changing the method much as it’s tilting at windmills.

So yes, basically again the Head Judge is given a tally of the specific FIRST place winners in each of the General categories, qualified teams of the same judging pool are gathered to go with the lists for each, and do their best to swiftly winnow out the Best of those best for that event. Although some arenas will have some who perpetuate that size does matter, or certain subjects within their genres will gain or lose favor at this juncture. My own first hand experience from many angles inside and outside the Judging pool, comparing notes with others, seems to bear out that none of it does have an edge in the end. Smaller, more obscure or less popular have triumphed here more often than not, and likely will continue surprise in future.

Lester Tockerman Memorial Award Series
(Junior/Youth entrants **only** are eligible)
Sponsored by Mick Burton/MIRANDCO

3 part Memorial Award – Lester was a big guy, with big output, it is deserved

It Figures First – Junior/Youth modeler who has the MOST entries at the event (regardless if any or all win) Lester was always about promoting modelling to the young and he as a teacher especially fond of seeing that spark lit .

So to match his prolific entry output and encourage more like him I award 50 bucks

It Figures (Again) – Junior/Youth Modeler who has two or more Figure and/or Armor vehicle entries. In event of a tie or multiple entries by a modeler of one not the other, judgement will go to the one who has both first, then to one who has most of one or the other

Again, Lester’s two most passionate genres, to encourage more alike I award 25 bucks

It Figures (‘N All Adds Up) – Junior/Youth Modeler who has placed second or tied for the It Figures “Again” award - who has two or more Figure and/or Armor vehicle entries.

If not any one for that, then runner up for most entries award “It Figures First” wins 25 bucks

SORRY, NO SWEEPS for this Award Series. One Award each will be given to a Junior or Youth modeler (up to three) as accorded by the nature of the event’s competition and attendance. ***Please note the following:***

YOU MUST BE PRESENT AT EVENT AT TIME OF AWARD TO WIN! No Proxy or Absentee Winner

The Sponsor of this award series is the sole financial resource for this. No Fremont Hornets Club monies are involved and all costs of producing the awards are also on behalf of the Sponsor. The Club graciously gives The Sponsor the opportunity to provide chance to win this award to eligible entrants for this event year and may elect to continue or forgo this provision in future Tri City Classics, at discretion of the Contest Director

Other than aircraft (Real Space, Automotive, Maritime, tie in Movies/TV) :

James Bond 007's specific automobiles, MOL, X-20, X-37, KH-11, Corona satellites, “Fishing Boats and Trawlers of USSR, PRC, USA, UK etc with suspicious lack of such equipment aboard...”, Lotus KAR 120C, Agent 86's Sunbeam Tiger...

BRIEF: A movie by that very title, celebrates its 70th anniversary with our theme movie made 30 years later, and shares critic's take of them both as : Great aircraft flying scenes movie, as that nearly could be called recruitment film for US military service (US Air Force in 1956's Toward The Unknown, US Navy in 1986's Top Gun), with heavy pro USA propaganda tone... *Okay!* While then as now, TTU film has its detractors and critics, also has its fans and proponents, of which Contest Director is one.

Sure, the USAF, Edwards Air Force Base went out of their way to support fully “ Toward The Unknown ”, well known at the time, far from shocking also. Yet they also let TTU have movie plot points which coincidentally mirror “Top Gun” use of truth of Maverick's dad's demise in its story. Ones that weren't particularly flattering to US Government or so well known at time.

Namely: How the main character Major Bond was basically considered “unreliable and suspect” for any useful further military service. After being subjected to torture, brainwashing and eventually he ended up “confessing” to “ war crimes ” during his 14 months as pilot POW in Korea. Also noted just how he “goes unstably violent when restrained” during a fight scene in the film. All of which TTU film based on true history of an American WW2 ace and then a Korean War air vet Walker “Bud” Mahurin, who suffered similar actual events. As did the TTU film's “air boss” Lt Col. Pete Everest (he was an X-2 pilot too!), with whom William Holden (Maj Bond in movie and film's producer) became close to during the filming. This real life history sharing also included another real life pilot of Bell X-2, Milburn “Mel” Apt, who died after being first to break Mach 3 in the real airplane. Mr. Holden's character Major Bond survives the TTU film's X-2 demise, by the way. Also saves his doubters and proved right

Another, sad parallel between two films: Toward The Unknown's “Gilbert XF-120” fighter ? Really a Martin XB-51 bomber, then in test at Edwards AFB. The one used in film was flying to Eglin AFB in Florida from Edwards AFB, still in its “XF-120” markings, for an extra footage shoot when it crashed after a refuel stop in Texas, killing pilot. This is not well known even now. Top Gun ends on a dedication to memory of legendary pilot Art Scholl, who died during its filming, lost doing intentional spin.

So, in a nod to all those who brave the unknown to explore and pioneer, so that others may live, this award is offered for TC-18

Best Aircraft Carrier (includes helo only vessels)

The Fremont Hornets 2026/27 President's Award for TC-18

BRIEF: ANY (using modern day definitions) CATOBAR, STOBAR, STOVL or Helicopter/Amphibious Assault carrier ships (note that not all helicopter carriers are considered Amphibious Assault vessels)

Which means in 2026 there are 14 countries operational with “aircraft carriers, at least one” by this definition.

The President decided it was not at all sensible for the Contest Director to leave out chance for a nice Special Award with this year's theme, by ignoring a clear part of the success quotient of the entire premise (Carrier Aviation), namely Aircraft Carrier!

As well too, so much history with these ships has been recorded yet the aircraft component is often the focus popularly and yet again the entire support system, personnel aren't enough recognized equally. So she has set this award up to rectify for once !

THE CONTEST : Any period, any nation, as long as vessel fits within the four general definitions given at first of this article.

So don't sign up catapult launch seaplane fighter or recce aircraft ship as they are not equipped so as to qualify, by definition.

DO consider there a huge number of World War I, between wars, World War 2 and into the 1970s vessels that served and can be rendered in model form pretty easily to qualify in most commonly accepted traditional aircraft carrier format. Since 1970s a number of significant design formats evolved that still essentially fit the “Hard Deck” concept quite clearly and should compete

As a favor to the more casual reader not prone to look this stuff up as I had to do, here is a quick summary guide on terms above

CATOBAR – Catapult Assisted Take Off But Assisted Recovery (for most, the very definition of an aircraft carrier, in essence)

STOBAR – Short Take Off But Assisted Recovery (think of Ski Jump with enough deck space for an arrested by wire landing)

STOVL – Short Take Off Vertical Landing (think of may have ski jump or not, either way only enough deck for short take off)
